IN A WORD

At the farthest reaches of the Bernese Oberland, Grand Hotel Belvedere is reborn. As the first acquisition of the Beaumier group in Switzerland, it reveals a hidden beauty: the village of Wengen, overlooking the Lauterbrunnen Valley. The very same valley that inspired Romantic artists and their heirs, such as J. R. R. Tolkien, before becoming a cradle of skiing and a prime destination for hiking, favored by the English aristocracy.

Today, all the pleasures of the peaks, all the sensations they offer, both winter and summer, are gathered in one single place.



ROOMS & SUITES

Grand Hotel Belvedere features 90 rooms and suites, recently fully renovated, with a design that harmoniously blends contemporary lines with alpine heritage.





ARCHITECTURE

From their first visits to the site, the Swiss architects from *Complete Works, Crausaz Tremblay* and *Clavien & Associates* were captivated by the sweeping views of the Jungfrau, as well as the Heimatstil and Art Nouveau remnants in the lounges. These elements, which inspire respect, guided the design of a lasting project.

The result? After months of construction, the early 20th-century decorative elements have been reintroduced into the restaurant and lobby spaces. Just like the views from the terraces, balconies, and windows: hypnotic.

In the 90 rooms and suites, these elements inspire a «bridge» concept: the environment defines the decor. Everywhere, through a minimalist and grounded scenography, respect for local traditions takes center stage. Handcrafted carpets, custom pine furniture, wood paneling, lime-washed walls, serpentine green bathrooms, and thick wool textiles... all create clean, cocoon-like spaces in direct connection with the mountain.

The same sense of communion with the surrounding nature is felt from the spa, which evokes the essence of an onsen. Created from scratch between the two buildings, this brutalist concrete structure blends seamlessly into the surroundings, offering views over the hotel's gardens and forests.

SPA

Inspired by Japanese onsens, the spa at Grand Hotel Belvedere embodies the art of relaxation. Its minimalist design and mineral materials create the perfect setting for total relaxation. In perfect harmony with its surroundings, this wellness sanctuary in Wengen offers exceptional treatments by Susanne Kaufmann.

Created from organic and natural Alpine ingredients, this range stands out for its exceptional concentration of active ingredients, ensuring optimal results.

After their treatment, guests are invited to extend their moment of serenity in the relaxation room, where they can sip an herbal tea while admiring the spectacular view of the Jungfrau. They can then immerse themselves in the pool, surrounded by the hotel's gardens and the nearby forest.

GASTRONOMY



BRASSERIE BELVEDERE

Elegant, composed, and cozy, Brasserie Belvedere delights every appetite with its brasserie classics that evoke the flavors of the past: roasted cauliflower with Black Forest miso, rösti with caviar from the Bernese Alps, Swiss beef cheeseburger with Gruyère...

The bars, more intimate, offer an English-style atmosphere with a late-day menu (infusions, Swiss wines and spirits, cocktails...).



SONNENBAD

On the terrace of the Sonnenbad, the celebration begins, with platters of charcuterie, fondues, and lake fish grilled on the barbecue, accompanied by live music. Everywhere, comfort, attentiveness, and perfect timing.





GASTRONOMIE

RESTAURANT WALDRAND

At the Waldrand Restaurant, in a more relaxed, lively, and unpretentious atmosphere, the cuisine takes on a more cross-border flair: älpermagronen, a gratin of macaroni and potatoes with alpine cheese and crispy bacon, schnitzel with a fried organic egg, wild blueberry tart with Swiss meringue... the Alpine traditions are celebrated with finesse. Added to this is a bar, styled like a Swiss counter.

At Grand Hotel Belvedere, body and mind go hand in hand. Taking care of both is essential.

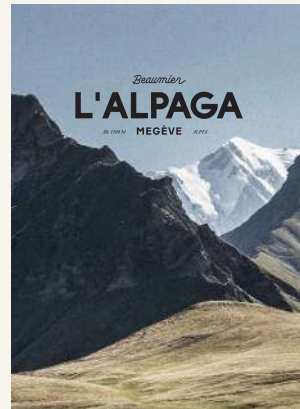
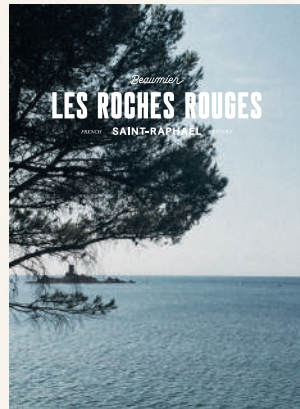
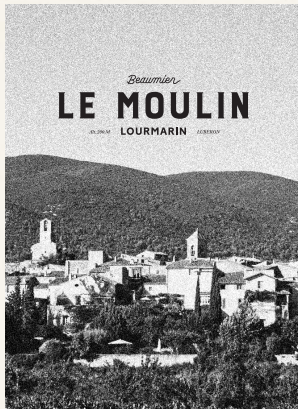
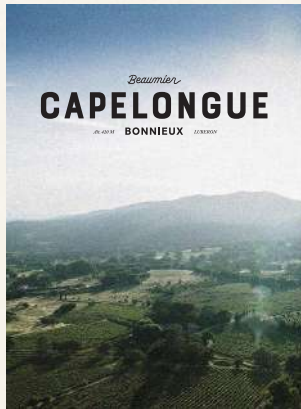
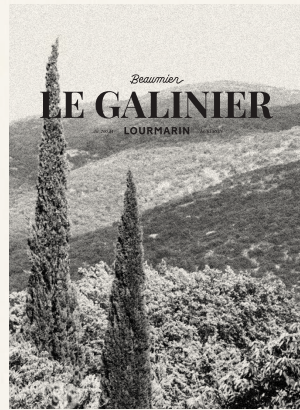
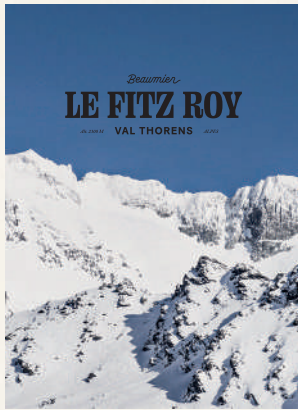
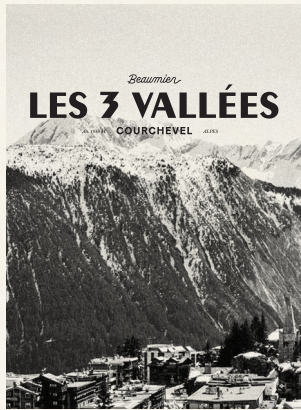
In the spa, of course, one of the hotel's standout features, with views of the Jungfrau, treatments, sauna, hammam, and an indoor and outdoor pool.
